Subject: Proposed Amendment to Chapter 10 – Employees Retirement System of the Code of the City of Troy

Section 3.6 (c) of this ordinance currently reads as follows:

The Assistant City Manager/Finance & Administration shall be the Administrative Officer and serve as the secretary of the Retirement System and he shall be the custodian of its money and investments.

As you know, we do not have an Assistant City Manager of Finance & Administration. As such, the Employees Retirement System board, as well as city management, recommends the following change to this section:

The City Manager or his/her designee shall be the Administrative Officer and serve as secretary of the Retirement System and he/she shall be the custodian of its money and investments.

As a point of information, I would be naming Monica Ireland, Assistant to the City Manager, as the Retirement Board Administrative Officer. Of course, Ms. Ireland will receive assistance from the City Manager's office, the Finance department, and our consultant, Tom Darling, C.P.A's and Associates.

CITY OF TROY
AN ORDINANCE TO AMEND
CHAPTER 10 OF THE CODE
OF THE CITY OF TROY

The City of Troy ordains:

Section 1. Short Title

This Ordinance shall be known and may be cited as an amendment to Chapter 10, Employee Retirement System of the Code of the City of Troy.

Section 2. Amendment

Section 3.6, shall be amended as follows:

The Board of Trustees is vested with the power and authority to administer, manage and operate the retirement system, and to construe and make effective the provisions of this Chapter. The Board shall consist of eight trustees as follows:

(C)The ~~Assistant City Manager/Finance & Administration~~ City Manager or his/her designee shall be the Administrative Officer and serve as secretary of the Retirement System and ~~he~~ he/she shall be the custodian of its money and investments.

Section 3. Repeal

All ordinances or parts of ordinances in conflict herewith are hereby repealed only to the extent necessary to give this ordinance full force and effect.

Section 4. Savings

All proceedings pending, and all rights and liabilities existing, acquired or incurred, at the time this Ordinance takes effect, are hereby saved. Such proceedings may be consummated under and according to the ordinance in force at the time such proceedings were commenced. This ordinance shall not be construed to alter, affect, or abate any pending prosecution, or prevent prosecution hereafter instituted under any ordinance specifically or impliedly repealed or amended by this ordinance adopting this penal regulation, for offenses committed prior to the effective date of this ordinance; and new prosecutions may be instituted and all prosecutions pending at the effective date of this ordinance may be continued, for offenses committed prior to the effective date of this ordinance, under and in accordance with the provisions of any ordinance in force at the time of the commission of such offense.

Section 5. Severability Clause

Should any word, phrase, sentence, paragraph or section of this Ordinance be held invalid or unconstitutional, the remaining provision of this ordinance shall remain in full force and effect.

Section 6. Effective Date

This Ordinance shall become effective ten (10) days from the date hereof or upon publication, whichever shall later occur.

This Ordinance is enacted by the Council of the City of Troy, Oakland County, Michigan, at a Regular Meeting of the City Council held at City Hall, 500 W. Big Beaver, Troy, MI, on the 25 day of July, 2011.
