It demonstrates how people with learning disabilities deal with everyday challenges and offers measures educators can use to help reduce a student’s anxiety in group settings. Werpetinski also reported that a resolution was passed to allow City Clerk Tonni Bartholomew to execute a grant application agreement with the State of Michigan, Michigan Department of State for the purchase of AutoMARK ballot marking devices and related Election Management System (EMS) programming software for use by individuals with disabilities pursuant to the Help America Vote Act.

**ITEM H - OLD BUSINESS**

House reported for Done that students from Lawrence Tech University will attend either the August or September meeting to present information on 'universal design'.

Werpetinski spoke with Brian Stoutenburg, Library Director, regarding future alterations for handicap access at the Library. They agreed that a drive-thru facility would best serve the community, and in particular, those persons with disabilities. Subsequently the committee approved a letter urging the City Council to consider a drive-thru option.

Hyun reported that Special Education students at Troy High School help with decorations at dances as a way of participating in activities. Sadd and Project Lead also include Special Education students in their projects. Hyun will follow up with her school next season as to what activities are available.

Weidman reported that she would like to see Athens make more efforts toward inclusion in the 2006-2007 school year. In the past they had a study buddy and a mentoring program in place.

It was reported that the Troy School District Special Education Services Building has no automated door.
