Subject: Adoption of the Oakland County Hazard Mitigation Plan

History

In order to be eligible for Federal Hazard Mitigation Grants as authorized under Section 404 of the Robert T. Stafford Disaster Relief and Emergency Assistance Hazard Mitigation Grant Program, FEMA has mandated that governmental units have in place a comprehensive disaster and hazard mitigation plan. Locally, eligibility for these grants requires adoption of and participation in the Oakland County Hazard Mitigation Plan.

The City of Troy's Emergency Response and Preparedness Team, a joint police and fire department operation, assisted in the development of the county-wide plan. On January 13, 2013, the Oakland County Board of Commissioners adopted the Oakland County Hazard Mitigation Plan.
