NOTICE OF INTENT TO CONSTRUCT A TRANSMISSION LINE**

- International Transmission Company, d/b/a ITCTransmission will construct a major transmission line running from and through Sterling Heights, Troy, Clawson, and Royal Oak, Michigan, if the Michigan Public Service Commission grants it a certificate of public convenience and necessity.

The Michigan Public Service Commission (Commission) will hold a public hearing to consider the February 27, 2007 application, of International Transmission Company, d/b/a *ITCTransmission*, (ITC) for a certificate of public convenience and necessity to construct a major transmission line to meet the increased need for transmission infrastructure in Southeastern Michigan. ITC proposes to construct the major transmission line through Sterling Heights, Troy, Clawson, and Royal Oak, Michigan.

All documents filed in this case shall be submitted electronically through the Commission's E-Dockets Website at: www.michigan.gov/mpscedockets. Requirements and instructions for filing can be found in the User Manual on the E-Dockets help page. Any person wishing to intervene and become a party to the case shall electronically file a petition to intervene with this Commission by April 3, 2007. (Residential customers may file petitions to intervene using the traditional paper format.) The proof of service shall indicate service upon the ITC's attorney, Albert Ernst, at Dykema Gossett PLLC, Capitol View, 201 Townsend Street, Suite 900, Lansing, Michigan 48933.

Any person wishing to make a statement of position without becoming a party to the case, may participate by filing an appearance. To file an appearance, the individual must attend the hearing and advise the presiding administrative law judge of his or her wish to make a statement of position. All information submitted to the Commission in this matter will become public information: available on the Michigan Public Service Commission's Web site, and subject to disclosure.
