- Consumers Energy Company proposes to reconcile its gas cost recovery costs and revenues for the 12-month period April 2006 through March 2007 and to reconcile its pension and Other Post Retirement Benefits expenses for 2006, if the Michigan Public Service Commission approves its request.

The Michigan Public Service Commission (Commission) will hold a public hearing to consider the June 29, 2007 application of Consumers Energy Company (Consumers Energy) for reconciliation of gas cost recovery costs and revenues for the 12-month period April 2006 through March 2007. Consumers Energy proposes to use a roll-in methodology to issue a refund of \$5.33 million to its customers for the 2006-2007 GCR period. Consumers also propose to reconcile its PEM and OPEB for 2006.

Any person wishing to intervene and become a party to the case shall electronically file a petition to intervene with this Commission by August 22, 2007. (Residential customers may file petitions to intervene using the traditional paper format.) The proof of service shall indicate service upon Consumers Energy's attorney, H. Richard Chambers, One Energy Plaza, Jackson, Michigan 49201-2276.

Any person wishing to make a statement of position without becoming a party to the case, may participate by filing an appearance. To file an appearance, the individual must attend the hearing and advise the presiding administrative law judge of his or her wish to make a statement of position. All information submitted to the Commission in this matter will become public information: available on the Michigan Public Service Commission's Web site, and subject to disclosure.
