5. HEARING OF CASES

A. WAIVER REQUEST, JENNIFER DURHAM, 477 HURST – In order to keep 6 chickens, a waiver from the requirement that the property be at least .75 of an acre in size. The property is approximately .543 acres in size. Animal Ordinance Section 90.70.20 (f).

Mr. Evans advised the Board that the applicant cannot be present tonight and has requested postponement to the regularly scheduled March 25, 2015 meeting.

B. WAIVER REQUEST, RODGER WALTERS, 1265 BOYD – In order to keep 2 chickens, a waiver from the requirement that the property be at least .75 of an acre in size. The property is approximately .165 acres in size. Animal Ordinance Section 90.70.20 (f).

Mr. Walters presented the following:

- o The Animal Ordinance is dated and needs to be changed.
- o There are very few parcels .75 acres or larger in Troy.
- o He has had 2 chickens for the past 10 years.
- o He views them as pets.
- o There will not be roosters.
- o He believes 2 chickens are not harmful to the neighborhood.
- o The backyard is fenced and the chickens will be housed in a 4' x 6' sealed cage that will be 1' off the ground.

Ms. Lancaster and Board Member Knight advised that the City Council, not the Animal Control Appeals Board, has authority to change the Animal Control Code. In response to Mr. Walters query, Mr. Evans explained the rationale for having an Appeals Board.

The public hearing was opened.

JoLynne Nagayama and Stanley Nagayama, 1251 Boyd, spoke in favor of the request.

Mr. Evans summarized two written comments, both in favor, filed by other Boyd Street residents. On a map presented on the overhead projector, he identified the location of each commenter. Mr. Evans also reminded the Board of favorable public written comments that accompanied the Appeals Application.

The public hearing was closed.


5. OTHER BUSINESS

The Board and staff discussed Robert's Rules of Order, criteria applicable to waiver requests, and other procedures germane to waiver requests.


