SITE CONDOMINIUM DEVELOPMENT REVIEW

5. PRELIMINARY SITE PLAN REVIEW – Proposed Pinery Woods Site Condominium, 26 units/lots, North side of Wattles between Greensboro and Forsyth, Section 13, Currently Zoned R-1C (One Family Residential) District

Mr. Carlisle presented the report summarizing the application. He noted the conventional layout of the subdivision which necessitated mass grading and tree removal. The developer was preserving only 8 trees out of the 464 marked trees on site and not utilizing the natural drainage pattern on the site.

There was general discussion on the item including questions for the applicant and his Civil Engineer.

Nathan Robinson of Horizon Engineering, engineer for the developer, addressed issues brought up in the report including tree removal and wetlands.

Mr. Robinson cited examples in the past where Best Management Practices (BMP) related to stormwater faced hurdles getting approval from the Engineering Department during Final Site Plan Approval.

Mr. Savidant stated the Engineering Department was generally supportive of BMP and reviewed all potential projects on a case by case basis. He stated that as an example of City support, there is a City-owned bio-retention basin on Lovell.

Mr. Savidant stated the Planning Commission could postpone an item if it was related to public health, safety and welfare; further, if reasons for postponement were related to the issues discussed during the meeting and providing the applicant with an opportunity to address those issues.

Mr. Motzny agreed with Mr. Savidant regarding postponement. He reminded the Planning Commission that if an application meets all Zoning Ordinance requirements, the application should be approved.
