

The final report to de-list 2356 East Long lake Road will be re-submitted with detailed information requested by the Department of History Arts and Letters.

Inaccuracies in the records for 2356 E. Long Lake Road confirm the need to evaluate the records for all designated resources in the city. It is necessary to verify existing information and provide missing documentation. This will be a significant challenge for the committee. Loraine will contact Dorothy Scott about obtaining her copies of records to assist in this process.

The committee and Commission discussed the Troy Farm site at South Blvd. and Beach Rd. that is part of the Lloyd A. Stage Nature Center. The barns on the property probably date to 1860 and 1890. The farm site is one of the few remaining in the city. Loraine will discuss with Allan Motzny provisions in the ordinance for designating resources owned by the city.
