**New Business**

- A. Streamlining Boards and Committees – Parks and Recreation staff act as liaisons to several City committees/boards. City Council requested information on the number of boards/committees, staff involvement, etc. Ms. Anderson presented two reports on City Boards/Committees. The first report addressed those boards/committees. The second was a Council report addressing all boards/committees. City Council will consider this matter in the near future.

**Old Business**

- A. City Budget Issues – Sixteen Parks and Recreation employees were laid off July 1, 2010. Discussion followed regarding options for the department and the role this Board could take.

**Staff Reports**

Director's Report – As of June 15, 2010, both Golf Courses are now managed by Billy Casper Golf.

The next Parks and Recreation Advisory Board meeting will be in November and it was agreed by all that the new start time will be 6:30 pm.

Ms. Anderson distributed Stage Nature Society applications. This 501C3 organization is working toward keeping the Nature Center open after July 1, 2011 when it is slated to close.

Recreation Report – The Aquatic Center had a very good season this past summer. Attendance was more than 50,000 visits. Initial projections are that revenue will exceed expenditures by approximately \$50,000, not including depreciation.

The new Personal Trainer brochure was distributed. This new brochure highlights the personal trainers and gives the cost.

Due to lay-offs of staff, some programs have either been eliminated, reassigned to other staff, or restructured.

Parks Report – All of the restrooms in the parks have been or will be painted red with brown trim.

Milverton Park is being developed with Community Development Block Grant money at no cost to the City. This fall, installation of a shelter, swings, and a new sign will be completed.
