
Subject: City Council Member Questions and Responses

## Clarification for Item I-4 from Brian Kischnick

### I-04 BUDGET APPROPRIATION FROM GENERAL FUND FUND BALANCE - LOCAL AND MAJOR ROAD SLAB REPLACEMENT AND ASPHALT OVERLAY

The map on page 4 (pictured below) indicates in blue a proposed **ADDITIONAL** \$2.6 million.



**Subject: J-04A SPR2 LOW BIDDER MEETING SPECIFICATIONS - LIGHTS OF HOPE**

- Curious if the Kiwanis are participating in the cost of this any longer. This started as a nice private/public cooperative venture, but it now appears to be a city deal completely. Even if we have a onetime light purchase, it looks like we are outsourcing the installation annually now to the tune of \$40,000.

**Response:**

The Kiwanis is no longer participating/partnering with the city on this project. In fact, Kiwanis approached the city for a letter accepting the donation of the remaining lights which was the older style lights and only enough to complete 1 tree out of 225. I believe Mark Miller handled this with Kiwanis and I accepted the lights.

If the project was to continue in future years we would only have the cost to install and remove for the next 3-5 years until the lights would need to be replaced.
