**3. Request for Sidewalk Waiver – West side of Beach Road, south of Long Lake**

Joe Maniaci requests a waiver of the sidewalk required along the west side of Beach Road, south of Long Lake, abutting the property of the proposed Beachview Estates development (Parcel # 88-20-18-127-012).

The Department of Public Work recommends denial of this waiver request per the attached memo from the Director and Superintendent of Parks, Streets and Drains.

Petitioner states that “the impact of installing a sidewalk will mandate the removal of some long established trees and diminish the aesthetics along Beach Road”. Mr. Maniaci also

stated that tree removals would be significant and the majority of Beach does not have sidewalk.

Mr. Ziegendfelder asked about interior sidewalks within the development [yes, there will be sidewalk within the development itself]. Mr. Ziegendfelder believes that sidewalks should be installed as over time they will connect to something.

Mr. Halsey stated that the only way sidewalks would be constructed on Beach is when residents desire them and pay for them.

Mr. Petruilis uses Beach all the time and does not see a need for sidewalks on this section as most of Beach does not have sidewalks.

Mr. Ogg stated that the corridor is already very tight.

Traffic Engineering did receive one (1) call from a resident who was opposed to the waiver on the grounds that any new development should be required to install sidewalk as over time sidewalks would be located throughout the City.

There were no members of the public at the meeting, other than the petitioner.

**RESOLUTION # 2013-04-07**

**WHEREAS**, City of Troy Ordinances, Chapter 34 allows the Traffic Committee to grant waivers of the City of Troy Design Standards for Sidewalks upon a demonstration of necessity; and

**WHEREAS**, Joe Maniaci has requested a waiver of the requirement to construct sidewalk on the property because there are no other sidewalks in the area and the impact of installing a sidewalk will mandate the removal of some long established trees and diminish the aesthetics along Beach Road; and

**WHEREAS**, the Traffic Committee has determined the following:

- a. A waiver will not impair the public health, safety or general welfare of the inhabitants of the City and will not unreasonably diminish or impair established property values within the surrounding area, and
- b. A strict application of the requirements to construct a sidewalk would result in practical difficulties to, or undue hardship upon, the owners, and
- c. The construction of a new sidewalk would lead nowhere and connect to no other walk, and thus will not serve the purpose of a pedestrian travel-way.

**NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED** that the Traffic Committee **GRANTS** a waiver of the sidewalk requirement for the property along the west side of Beach Road, south of Long Lake, abutting the property of the proposed Beachview Estates development (Parcel # 88-20-18-127-012), which is owned by Joe Maniaci.


There were no members of the public at the meeting.
